

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should have a Bachelor Degree in Psychology, the Behavioural Sciences or a related field. Students who do not have a Bachelors Degree in Psychology should have completed undergraduate courses in Psychology, Research Methods and Statistics.

PROGRAMME COST

Tuition Fee: Bds \$20,000 (US \$10,000)

Payable in full or per course on registration.

Annual University Registration Fees

University Registration Fees are NOT included in the cost of the tuition fee.



PROGRAMME SUMMARY

The MSc. Counselling Psychology programme was developed to meet the growing need for qualified counsellors in Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean. The programme targets recent university graduates and practitioners who require counselling skills to fulfill their job tasks and provide counselling services to persons in organisations and society. Graduates of the programme will be prepared to pursue successful careers in the field of psychology and teaching at various levels in organisations. The programme is also designed to ensure that students have a competitive advantage for advanced study in psychology. Graduates of the programme will develop counselling, psychological assessment and research skills that will enable them to assist individuals, couples and groups who are facing various mental health issues.

PROGRAMME REGULATIONS

The programme will be delivered on a full-time or part-time basis using a blended format: online and face-to-face. All courses include an online component, which is delivered through Moodle in e-learning. The online component occurs throughout the semester. The face-to-face (residency) component requires students to be present in class from 9:00 am- 5:00 pm on Fridays and Saturdays for 3 face-to-face weekends per course. Full-time students will complete the programme in four (4) semesters and one (1) summer. Part-time students will complete the programme in six (6) semesters and two (2) summers. The taught component of the programme includes ten (10) courses for the research option and 12 courses for the practice option. Both options include a practicum (0 credits) and an integrative internship and seminar (12 credits). The research option includes a research paper (6 credits).

PROGRAMME CONTENT

A total of forty-eight (48) credits are required to complete either programme.

MSC COUNSELLING PSYCHOLOGY PROGRAMME -**RESEARCH OPTION**

This option is for students who are considering going for a doctorate degree in psychology. It requires the completion of a 20,000-word research paper on an issue relevant to the field of psychology. The research paper will ensure that students are involved in conducting empirically sound scholarly research. This also enables students to develop research skills that can be used to address organisational and societal problems related to the therapy needs of individuals. In addition, student research will contribute body of knowledge of psychology and research on psychological issues in the Caribbean. Students who select this option are also adequately prepared for professional practice.

MSC COUNSELLING PSYCHOLOGY PROGRAMME -**PRACTICE OPTION**

This option is for students who are considering being practitioners. Students are required to complete two additional courses instead of completing the research paper. The courses will ensure that students are more prepared to engage in clinical/counselling practice. Students who select this option are also adequately prepared for doctoral level training.

EVALUATION OF COURSES AND COURSEWORK

Each course in the programme is assessed by either 100% coursework or a combination of 50 % coursework and 50% written examination. In order to pass courses, students must obtain a minimum of 50% in courses assessed by coursework only. For courses assessed by both coursework and written examination, students must a minimum of 50% on both components. If a student fails a course, he or she is allowed to repeat the course only once.

The practicum lab provides students with hands on experience and exposure to working with clients along with other didactic training. It also prepares students for integrative internship and seminar. The practicum lab course is worth (0) credits; however, students obtain 40 hours of supervised clinical experience which includes both direct and indirect hours. Finally, students are required to complete the practicum lab before proceeding to the integrative internship and

Internationally, practical work experience during graduate study is a critical component of graduate programmes to ensure student readiness for the world of work. The clinical internship is taken over two (2) semesters. The integrative internship and seminar allows students to utilize the knowledge, skills, and exposure gained during coursework and practicum. This knowledge is then applied during the internship placement. During the internship placement, students will be trained and supervised by suitably qualified psychologists; thus, preparing them to be competent for practice in counselling psychology. In addition, students are expected to attend the integrative seminars and make formal presentations about their internship experience.

Students are also expected to complete individual therapy no less than 12 hours with a registered psychologist or psychiatrist. This cost is absorbed by the student.
